Student Information (E-Mail/Cellphone)

Attendance

The 24 hour Attendance Hotline number is (06) 759-8839. You are asked to phone this number before 9.00 am each day your son is absent, leaving his name, level and group, reason for his absence and a return telephone number. Notes will not be required from parents who phone in unless the student is absent for a major assessment. Student Services will attempt to telephone parents/caregivers of all boys absent period 1 who have not phoned in.

Where a student is going to be away on non-school business a letter/e-mail must be sent to the Headmaster asking for permission to be absent from school. This applies to, for instance, national sporting championships and overseas trips outside school holidays. Likewise where it is known that a student is to be absent because of medical reasons a prior note would be appreciated.

Unexplained absences/lateness are passed on to your son's Dean for further action, which may include detention.

Lateness / Sickness and Appointments

Where possible all appointments should be made outside school hours. However, if a student is late arriving to school, or is leaving for an appointment during school time, they must report to Student Services. Students who are late must produce a note of explanation from their parent/caregiver. If leaving school for an appointment a note, or appointment card, must be shown and a pass for the time they are away from the school will be issued.

Any student who becomes unwell MUST NOT contact parents direct. They must go to Student Services who will in turn make contact with a parent/caregiver.

School Hours

Please note for 2012, the school day has changed: Lunch is 10 minutes shorter and the school day finishes at 3.10pm

On Thursday the school day begins at 9.05am to allow the staff more time for Professional Development.

No student is permitted to leave the school at lunchtime unless they have a note signed by a parent/caregiver. This must be shown at Student Services when boys sign out. Should the student have an appointment then they must either produce an appointment card or a note from parent/caregiver.

Uniform

When parents sign the enrolment form to enter NPBHS they are signing an agreement that they will do everything to ensure that their sons obey the stated regulations.

In particular:

- The uniform of the school must be worn by all students and maintained in a clean and tidy condition.
- Hair should be clean, groomed, a natural colour of no more than moderate length and off the collar.
- Extreme styles such as: dreadlocks, braids, No. 1's, mohawks, colours, stripes or rats tails are unacceptable. Students must be clean shaven.
- Jewellery, other than a wrist watch, must not be worn to school.
- Footwear will be removed by students using carpeted rooms such as the Library and Boarders' Lounge.
- All students are encouraged to wear a wide-brimmed hat or school cap for sun protection.
- Uniform is as follows:

Shirt	:	Grey with monogram
Shorts	:	Grey West Point Drill (summer weight). The long surfie type is not acceptable.
Pullover	:	Black with monogram
Blazer	:	Black with monogram
Jacket	:	Waterproof black with relieving white or yellow or both.
Sandal	:	Plain brown or black - must have a strap around the back - no writing or advertising - worn with shorts only. Jandals are prohibited.
Shoes	:	Plain black lace-up, or slip on leather shoes. Not canvas skate shoes or sports shoe type. <u>Shoes must take a shine.</u>
Socks	:	Black with bands in white and gold.
PE Gear	:	Appropriate change of clothes
Raincoat	:	Black
Parka	:	Black

Additional Items

Shorts	:	Black - for winter sports (optional)
Trousers	:	Plain black wool/terylene may be worn by fourth year students and above. They must hold a crease.
Socks	:	Black - worn with trousers
Shirt	:	White - worn by representative teams and boarders.
Singlet	:	House colour
Tie	:	Striped in school colours - worn with white shirt.
Hat	:	Wide-brimmed (Hadlee) style in white, or approved black school cap with crest.

All articles of clothing must be marked clearly with the student's name.

Uniform Shop Hours : The Uniform Shop is located next to Ryder Hall and is open Monday / Tuesday & Thursday, 12.30 pm to 2.30 pm of each week during term time. The shop will open from 4 January, 2012, Monday to Friday: 10.00 am to 3.00 pm and Saturday: 9.00 am to 12.00 noon until start of Term 1.

Lost Property

Lost property is stored in the Deputy Headmaster's office and may be claimed from there during school hours. To avoid this situation however, it would be appreciated if you could ensure your son's clothing is named.

Vehicle and Passenger Passes

ALL students needing to drive themselves to school or be passengers in another student's car must apply for a pass. In the interests of safety, the school recommends only students at Years 11 and above bring vehicles to school. These vehicles may only be used to come to and from school and must not be driven at lunch times. Students must not park in Wakefield Street, on Niger Terrace (by Fookes Pavilion), or drive, or park, within the school grounds.

We recommend that all motorcycles are parked on the motorcycle parking area on Rogan Street.

Vehicle / Passenger Pass application forms are located at the end of this document for you to complete and return to Student Services.

Tuckshop

The Tuck Shop is open daily at interval and lunchtime, and provides an extensive range of healthy food at competitive prices.

Lockers

Through fundraising the PTA has provided the school with 81 lockers which will be hired to Year 9 students only.

The cost of hiring a locker is \$40.00 and is payable to Student Services. This charge is made up of a \$20.00 bond and a hireage fee of \$20.00. In the first few days boys are to claim a locker on Level 2 of Alexander Block by placing a secure padlock on the one of their choice. They then register this number at Student Services along with their payment. A receipt will be issued, which students must keep in order to receive the bond component of the fee back at the end of the year.

PROMOTING A GOOD SCHOOL CLIMATE

THE STEPS SYSTEM

Unacceptable behaviour, inside and out of the classroom will have negative consequences for a student. If a student chooses to infringe further then the tighter the negative consequences become. Positive behaviour is recognised through a student being allowed to slip down a level if they have been clear over three school weeks.

Each year we dedicate one day where boys are involved with projects that benefit the school in a major way. Work Day has been held over many years, when boys offer their services to the people of New Plymouth and further afield, by doing modestly paid work for five hours, or longer. The hourly rate is \$5.00 (minimum) and the **TARGET** for each boy is \$30.00, we feel this is reasonable and achievable.

Last year, Work Day money was spent on upgrading the lighting in Ryder Hall. This year the money raised will be targeted for a project in the school, that is used by all students during their years at school.

The PTA offers great support in running the Work Day and will advertise in the newspaper for work offers in the first week of Term One. If you have work - simply make contact with:

Give your name, address, telephone number and specify the work available and the number of boys required.

Your son will need to start planning for this day. In the first two weeks of term 1 they will be asked by their group teachers to outline the work they are undertaking for that day. The students will then receive workday payment forms which thank the employers and outline how payment is to be made.

Work Day not only aids the resourcing of the school, but also develops social skills as your son could well be introducing themselves to their future employer. It also offers students a chance to gain part-time employment if they market themselves well by being responsible, well-mannered, honest and hardworking. It is not considered a "day off" from school.

If parents do not wish their son's to participate, they must attend school as per normal and will be supervised in study.
