RATIONALE:

Sport is an important part of the culture at New Plymouth Boys' High School. It allows the school to offer a holistic approach to education and gives students the opportunity to participate and excel beyond the classroom.

PURPOSE:

To offer a range of sports and sporting activities for the benefit of our students.

GUIDELINES:

The school will encourage all students to participate in a variety of sporting activities at all levels by:

- making every effort to ensure an equity of access for students to take part regardless of ethnicity or ability;
- ensuring that the appropriate physical education courses are offered as options in the senior school curriculum;
- providing a wide range of co-curricular sporting activities, the range determined by the availability of skills and interests of coaches and managers from the staff and community;
- providing inter-collegiate competition for elite teams;
- encouraging participation in sports in the wider community if they are not available through school;
- providing opportunities for students to perform in the national sporting arena;
- recognizing the achievements of students involved in all sporting activities both school and community based;



- acknowledging excellence in sporting performance;
- adopting the Fair Play Charter and promoting this code to all sporting activities;
- providing the appropriate facilities and equipment and allocating funds in the annual budget;
- providing staffing for a Sportfit Programme in conjunction with Sport and Recreation NZ;
- providing the opportunity for professional development of coaches and managers to increase performance of coaches, managers and participants;
- continuing membership of the Taranaki Secondary Schools' Sports Association, and thus contribute to the cost of employing a Regional Sports Director.
